Objectives:
Content— Students will evaluate the structure of the Federal Court System and analyze the functions of the federal court system and its outcomes
Language—Students will answer questions, verbally and in a worksheet, about the federal court system with 70% accuracy.
Student-friendly—I can explain what the federal court system is and how it works. Assessment:
Check for learning throughout the lesson by asking comprehension questions. Students will also complete a worksheet they will turn in by the next class.
Proactive Management: Call on some of the students who don't normally answer, no phones out
Instructional Strategies: Lecture, inquiry, socratic
Note Taking Strategy:
Students have access to the PowerPoints and all other resources used in the lesson, via teams
Questions: What are federal courts? What do federal courts do? What is jurisdiction? How is the court system organized? What are appeals? What do the federal courts do?
Anticipatory Set: Watch CNN 10 to catch up on current events Discuss the impact of what we watched on past, current, or future events

The Lesson: Outline of procedures including content, UDL, transitions, directions, pacing (provide estimated time), questions, check for learning, etc. Think detailed "sub-plan". Your plan should be easy to read and reference while teaching. Avoid writing paragraphs. Use "action" statements (i.e., start procedures with verbs).

Instruct the students they have 15 mins of silent reading time-Independent

Open powerpoint (the federal court system)

Lecture (20-25 mins)-focused learning

Video/Worksheet assignment-guided learning
